

DISTINGUISHING HYDROCOTYLES


It is very difficult to tell Hydrocotyle ranunculoides (which comes from the USA) from H. vulgaris (native to the UK). Leaf shape and characteristics are of use in identification (see below). It may be useful to ask your supplier to confirm what you are being sold.

As interest grows in invasive aquatic plants, there may be circumstances in which trading standards officers ask you to prove that what you sold is as described.



Hydrocotyle vulgaris

Matt and less dark green
May have long occasionally hairy stems
Grows in boggy areas which can be flooded
In late season spent flower spike remains
upright



Hydrocotyle ranunculoides

Deep cut in leaf toward leaf stem
Waxier darker green
More distinct central eye (where stalk meets leaf)
In late seesen apart flower prike hands down

In late season spent flower spike bends down Stems usually smooth with no hairs
